Amendment I. Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or <mark>abridging</mark> the freedom of speech, or of the <mark>press;</mark> or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for a redress of grievances.

No democracy has existed in the modern world without the existence of a **FREE PRESS**.

"When a corrupt government holds power, the press becomes a critical weapon."

John Peter Zenger was a German immigrant who printed a publication called The **NEW YORK WEEKLY JOURNAL**. This newspaper criticized the governor, **WILLIAM S. COSBY**. It accused the government of **rigging** elections among other things. Zenger was taken to jail.

Thomas Jefferson:

"The way to prevent irregular interpositions of the people is to give them full information of their affairs through the channel of the public papers, and to contrive that those papers should penetrate the whole mass of the people. The basis of our governments being the opinion of the people, the very first object should be to keep that right; and were it left to me to decide whether we should have a government without newspapers, or newspapers without a government, I should not hesitate a moment to prefer the latter."


